Come up with – think of

I have come up with a great idea to set up a business

Come down with – get ill

My sister has come down with the flu

Come up against – face difficulties

We came up against various issues during the construction

Come out – end up

The picture didn't come out as we had planned

Come in for – be criticized

My boss came in for a lot of criticism

Come out with – say something

Why did you come out with that response?

Come around – be convinced by

Don't worry, your girlfriend will come around

Come along – to progress well

The project is coming along nicely

Come into – to receive some money

I came into a lot of money when I inherited the house
