The next word in our vocabulary boost series is HANG. HANG is a high frequency verb that can be used as a synonym of *wait, hold, spend or place*. There are numerous collocations and phrasal verbs that are formed using HANG.

Hang on a decision

Hang with your friends – spend time with

Be hung for a crime – be executed

Hang your head in shame

Get the hang of something – learn how to do something

Hang a left – turn left (USA)

Phrasal verbs:

The learning of phrasal verbs is best done using this method ([HERE](#))

Hang on – wait

*Can you hang on a minute?*

Hang up – put down the phone

*After we finished the conversation, I hung up*

Hang out – spend time with

*I really enjoy hanging out with friends*

Hang around – to wait for a long time

*I wouldn't like to hang around for ages*

Hang on to – hold on to

*If you have a bit of spare cash, it is a good idea to hang on to it*

Hang back from – restrain from doing something

*You ought to hang back from criticizing your workmates in public*
