The next word in our vocabulary boost series is SET. SET is a high frequency verb that can be used as a synonym of *start, begin, establish, organize, place and put*. There are numerous collocations and phrasal verbs that are formed using SET.

Collocations:

To learn new collocations and word patterns you should create phrases using them and also do exercises ([HERE](#))

Set the table – put the plates and cutlery on the table

Set a condition – establish a limit or a state

Set on fire – ignite

Set a price – establish the cost of something

Set a date – establish a day or time for something to occur

Set an alarm – put the alarm on

Set a goal – establish an objective

Set sail – start a voyage

Set a good/bad example – be a good/bad influence on someone

Set a trap – try to catch someone (out)/capture

Phrasal verbs:

The learning of phrasal verbs is best done using this method ([HERE](#))

Set up – start a business

*I'm looking to set up a business of my own*

Set off – start a journey

*Let's set off early to avoid the traffic*

Set out – organize

*The coach set out the team in an attacking formation*

Set to – get started

*The sooner we set to work, the sooner we will finish*

Set aside – keep for a specific reason

*I have set aside a few thousand pounds for next year's vacations*
